Northwest Regional Fundraising Board Member Job Description

Term of Office: Three (3) years, renewable twice

Accountable To: Regional Director and Regional Board President

General Description: The NPH USA Regional Fundraising Board is integral to our

success and directly enables us to meet the needs of our children. Regional Fundraising Board Members serve as ambassadors for NPH in the community and help increase financial support for and public awareness of our mission.

Time Commitment: Approximately 40 hours annually

Responsibilities:

1. **Regularly attend meetings** (at least 4 of 6) of the Regional Fundraising Board.

- 2. **Make a significant personal financial contribution** annually to the organization that reinforces your commitment to our work. We expect that Board members consider NPH USA one of their top charities for philanthropic support. Annual giving ranges from \$1,500 to \$20,000 with median annual giving of \$6,300.
- 3. Attend special events, including both Faces of Hope and the Gala, **hosting one or more tables for at least one of these events**, and supporting other special events (ie cultivation events, golf tournament, church sponsorship drives) as needed.
- 4. **Introduce a minimum of 10 new, potential supporters** to the organization through special events, sponsorship, meetings, etc. Additionally, **share a minimum of 3 connections to businesses, churches, schools and/or other groups** that can host events or speakers, become corporate or institutional sponsors, etc.
- 5. **Support the region's efforts to cultivate and solicit major donors**, including reviewing prospect lists, making introductions, meeting 1:1 with potential donors, making thank you calls, etc.
- 6. Serve actively on at least one standing or ad hoc committee.
- 7. **Develop and implement Impact Plan** on an annual basis, which outlines your plans to personally support and rally others to support NPH USA.
- 8. **Consider becoming a sponsor** for a child in one of our homes or supporting a university student or the Seattle Leadership program.
- 9. **Visit one of the homes** within one year of board appointment if at all possible.
- 10. **Stay informed** about the organization's mission, services, and programs and share your candid and creative input into our goals and initiatives for the year.

Desired Qualifications:

- 1. Recognized leadership ability and experience previous Board or fundraising experience strongly preferred
- 2. Confidence, strong network and passion for rallying support from family, friends and colleagues to support NPH USA
- 3. An understanding of and commitment to philanthropy to support charitable causes in our community
- 4. Sincere and deep commitment to the mission of NPH USA

NPH USA transforms the lives of orphaned, abandoned and disadvantaged children in Latin America and the Caribbean by supporting the homes, healthcare and educational programs of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH, Spanish for "Our Little Brothers and Sisters"). Together, we create families for life and teach children the values of unconditional love, shared responsibility and helping others. Since its founding in 1954, NPH has assisted more than 20,000 children and is currently raising more than 3,400 boys and girls in Bolivia, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua and Peru. An additional 1,600 students who live outside the homes receive scholarships, meals and health care. NPH outreach programs provided over 95,000 services in 2014.

NPH USA is a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. Donations are tax deductible and help provide children with food, clothing, shelter, health care and an education, enabling them to overcome poverty and become leaders in their own communities. In 2014, NPH USA contributed \$11.1 million in donations and \$1.3 million in in-kind goods to support the children of NPH. The Northwest region raised over \$1.3 million in 2014.
