



Code of Conduct

NPH provides protection to vulnerable children and strengthens families and communities in Bolivia, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Nicaragua, Mexico, and Peru. NPH is committed to assuring the best possible care for our children through direct programs, through service to other caregivers and support organizations, and through direct engagement with the community where the children live.

Together we create a family environment that promotes the well-being of children and youth based on Father William Wasson's philosophy. Our goal is the fullest possible physical, intellectual, moral, and spiritual development of each individual child.

Our childcare standards reflect the rights of children and young people, as stated in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, the convention on the rights of persons with disabilities, and corresponding responsibilities as defined by Father Wasson's philosophy.

The aim of the code of conduct is to take responsibility for the safety, well-being, and protection of our children and youth in the NPH family and in family strengthening programs and the prevention of all kinds of discrimination, violence, or abuse against them.

All employees, volunteers and visitors of the NPH family must sign the code of conduct. By signing, the person commits to creating and maintaining an environment that is safe for children, youth, and all persons in need of care in the NPH family and family strengthening programs.

In this respect, I will:

1. respect children's human dignity and their need to be protected at all times.
2. undertake everything possible to protect children from neglect and from physical, psychological, and sexual abuse and exploitation.
3. treat all children, youth, and adults of the NPH family—including all those in our outreach programs—with respect.
4. treat the parents and guardians of the children and youth with dignity and respect at all times.
5. refrain from violent, discriminatory, racist, or sexist behavior—both verbal and nonverbal—towards children or in the presence of children.
6. respect the opinions and concerns of children and allow them to participate in all matters affecting them according to their age and maturity.
7. contribute to an environment where each child or youth is able to freely express their opinion without fear of victimization.
8. contribute to creating a safe, nurturing environment for children that is free from bullying, harassment, and discrimination.
9. take the children's beliefs and concerns seriously to foster their personal growth.
10. use positive discipline that is free of violence and humiliation.
11. model healthy and respectful relationships.
12. not share any details about a child personally or infringe upon the privacy of a child's family without permission.



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13. in order to respect each child's personal story, adhere to all NPH child media policies and not share any photographs or videos on any social media platform without permission.
14. report violations of child protection policies (i.e., NPH childcare policy, media policy, visitor policy).
15. adhere to all laws that govern the countries where NPH serves.

I will also refrain from any and all forms of threat, discrimination, physical, or verbal abuse. This means that I will never:

1. hug, kiss, or touch a child in any manner that is inappropriate or culturally insensitive.
2. abuse the power afforded by position or office on the life and well-being of a child.
3. hit or physically assault a child in any way.
4. place a child in unsupervised isolation.
5. abuse or exploit a child sexually, physically, or emotionally.
6. engage in sexual activities with a youth.
7. use language that is inappropriate or suggestive.
8. make sexual innuendos or suggestive actions toward a child.
9. tolerate or facilitate illegal, dangerous, or abusive conduct toward children.
