NPH AND THE PANDEMIC

In 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic caused many challenges around the globe. For NPH, these included:

- Quarantine/lockdown at the individual homes, some for several months
- Suspension of in-person school classes
- Departure of some staff and volunteers
- Extended work hours for staff, some of whom had to stay on site for weeks at a time
- Unbudgeted expenses for healthcare supplies, such as face masks, and technology to support online learning
- Increased costs of food, cleaning supplies, personal care products, medication and transportation
- Decreased availability/supply chain disruption of various foods and other items
- High levels of sadness, frustration and anxiety for children and staff

Despite all of the difficulties, NPH continued to provide the best physical, emotional, and mental care possible for the children. In addition, many of the homes provided food and supplies to *Hermanos Mayores* ("older siblings") who were raised at the home, and people in the community. In some locations, *Hermanos Mayores* and year of service youths helped offset staff shortages.

We are very grateful to all who make it possible for us to continue serving those who need it most.
