Our Mission

Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) means “Our Little Brothers and Sisters” in Spanish. NPH USA transforms the lives of vulnerable children in Bolivia, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, and Peru. Together, we help children overcome poverty and become productive, caring leaders in their own communities.

Founded in 1954 by Father William Wasson, **NPH is supporting more than 8,000 children and families**, both inside our homes and in surrounding communities, ensuring they have a safe and nurturing place to live, an education, clothing, health care, economic opportunity, and a strong family support system. NPH’s St. Damien Pediatric Hospital employs more than 500 Haitians and is the only hospital wholly dedicated to pediatric and prenatal care in Haiti, a country of 11.5 million people.

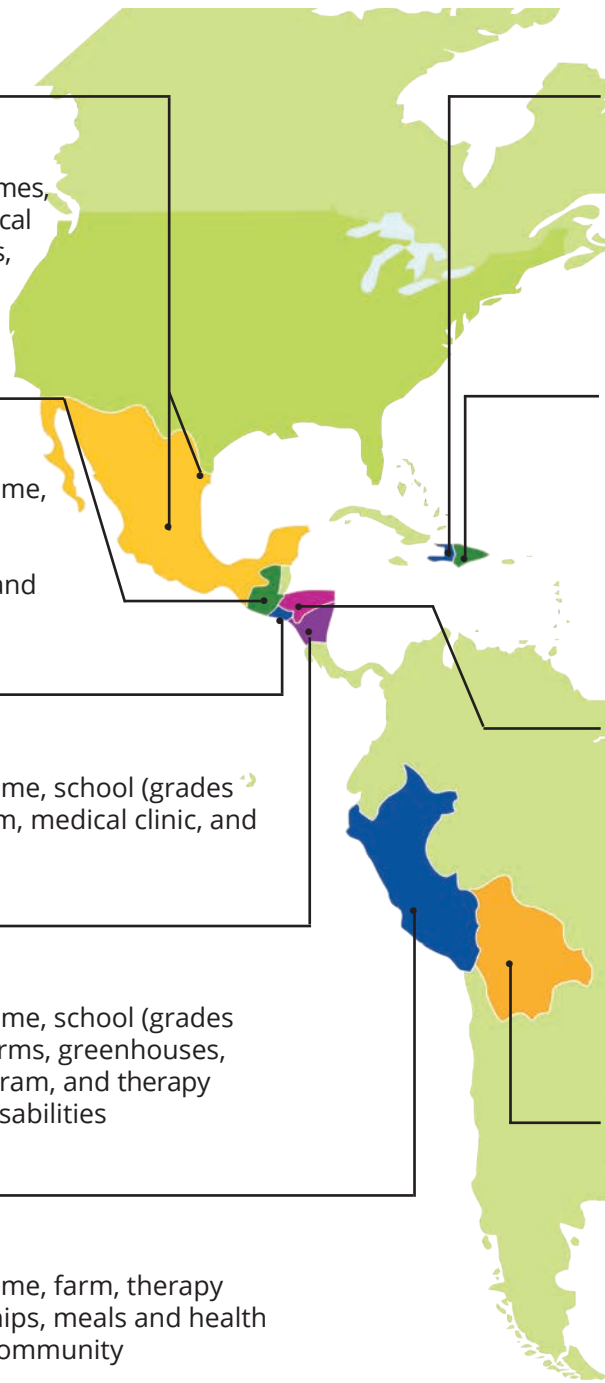

 NPH is expanding the work we do in reuniting and strengthening families, empowering young people, and preparing them to lead successful independent lives.

Caring for Children and Strengthening Families

Whether the children we care for live in our homes or with their families, we foster healthy family dynamics through necessary provisions, such as nutrition and wellness care, counseling, parental school, and psychosocial and financial support. We offer mental health support to children and help create an environment where they thrive. Our OneFamily program provides individualized support to children and their families to help them grow together and fulfill their unique potential.



Education and Development

Expanded programs in communities help fill service gaps, giving vulnerable youth access to schooling, essential tutoring, and counseling support. Youth who lack access to education have limited opportunities and often join gangs or end up in jobs with poverty-level wages. In 2022, NPH helped provide thousands of children with an education. More than 1,000 graduated from preschool through university, taking the next step to become successful, productive members of their community.





OUR IMPACT

Health and Wellbeing Services

Each of the NPH homes has medical clinics, providing the children with onsite access to health care services. Most also offer services to people in the community. For those who would otherwise not have access to health care, or not be able to afford access, these clinics are literally lifesaving.

We also work in partnership with One World Surgery which resides on our NPH campuses in Honduras, and the Dominican Republic. Brigades of medical staff conduct state-of-the-art procedures to treat pequeños and the nearby community. Without them, this vital care would not be available.

Support for Those with Disabilities

NPH is helping the most marginalized, physically and emotionally, by giving these children and adults the specialized care and compassion they need to develop. Residential care facilities and outpatient therapy centers provide access to education, specialized treatment, and love. NPH's programs help create opportunities for social reintegration, access to the labor market, and a life with dignity.

OUR IMPACT

Independent Living Readiness

Vocational training alone is not enough to ensure success. The acquisition of life skills and healthy self-esteem are necessary to fully leverage employment and job opportunities. NPH helps equip children and youth with both the hard skills of training and education, and the soft skills of character development, which include family values, spirituality, responsibility, positive self-image, emotional healing, and emotional development. NPH provides workforce training, as well as employment opportunities, for thousands of locals.

NPH'S ST. DAMIEN PEDIATRIC HOSPITAL

NPH's St. Damien Pediatric Hospital in the Tabarre area of Port-au-Prince, Haiti, gives health and hope to the people and children who have nowhere else to turn. St. Damien Pediatric Hospital is the only hospital wholly dedicated to pediatric and prenatal care in Haiti, a country of 11.5 million people. St. Damien provides the ONLY cancer care in the country; is one of the few options for high-risk OB and NICU patients; and continues to be a leader in providing HIV education and care.

In 2022, the socio-political situation, violence, kidnappings, gang control of Port-au-Prince, and blocking of national roads, further compounded Haiti's health issues. The violence and instability continue to have devastating consequences on the everyday lives of millions of children, young people, and families throughout the country.

Despite the huge challenges, St. Damien Pediatric Hospital remained operational for the entire year, except for a partial closure of 20 days in May 2022 to combat staff kidnappings. In keeping with the mission and vision of Father Wasson, the hospital responded yet again to health crises that hit the nation:

- St. Damien Hospital **opened a Cholera Treatment Center** in response to the major outbreak in Haiti in late 2022. The center treated 360 children during the fourth quarter of 2022.
- St. Damien Hospital **admitted 194 malnourished children** in 2022, an increase of 92% from 2021. Sadly, this is a serious health problem expected to grow in the coming years.

St. Damien relies nearly 100% upon donations to treat and save the lives of vulnerable patients with nowhere else to go. Thousands of newborn babies, pregnant women, cancer patients, and many others receive quality, compassionate care thanks to donors who believe poverty should not be a death sentence.

NPH helps **prepare adolescents and young adults for independence** through vocational training, university education, career and leadership training.

NPH is investing in new ways to serve children. You help us provide amazing opportunities for children to thrive, to break free from the cycle of poverty, and to become leaders in their communities.

Through your support, their dreams are realized. Through your love, their hearts are lifted to reach their fullest potential.

Our deepest thanks to you for everything you do for the children.

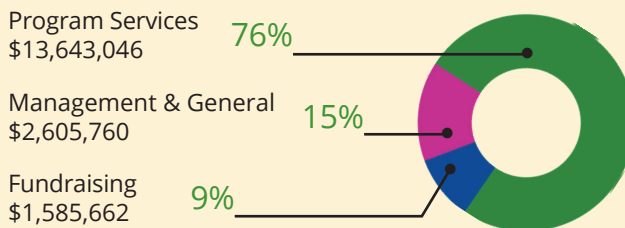

FR. WASSON LEGACY ENDOWMENT, INC.

WHAT IS THE FR. WASSON LEGACY ENDOWMENT?

The Fr. Wasson Legacy Endowment Inc. (FWLEI), a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, Tax ID #2005679, was founded in 1995 to help provide long-term financial stability for the homes and programs of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH). The Endowment consists of a diversified portfolio of equity, fixed income assets, and cash, governed by an independent board of directors and professionally managed.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

Reported by Jack Hansen, President, FWLEI

FWLEI has played an important role as a reliable source for NPH operating funds for many years. As a perpetual pool of assets, FWLEI distributes approximately 5% of the pool's value each year to help NPH USA support NPH's homes and programs.

Why is this important? As a stable source of operating funds for NPH, the Endowment provides stability and security in funding. This is vital for program continuity, ensuring the funding will be there to continue the great work of NPH. In 2022, FWLEI distributed over \$900,000 from the Endowment to support NPH homes and programs. In this way, FWLEI is able to bring greater long-term security to the mission of helping, protecting, and empowering vulnerable children.

In 2022, FWLEI continued to generate solid investment performance on an absolute and relative basis. While recent performance reflects the very difficult stock and bond market environments of last year, through Fiducient Advisors, the fund produced a total return after expenses of (-15.8%) which was 0.9% better than its benchmark. In a broader context, over the last 10 years, the fund has grown at an annualized rate of 7.9%. On an ongoing basis, FWLEI seeks to produce returns which track, and modestly exceed, market outcomes with a careful eye toward keeping costs low. Every dollar earned or saved is another dollar available to help the children whom we all care so deeply about.

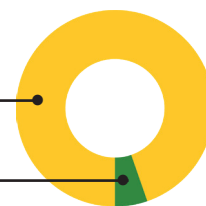
