

## **Highlights**

- **Bolivia:** Integrated "quasi-family" framework throughout the residential care program so that siblings can live together
- Dominican Republic: Victor Santos, an Hermano Mayor ("Older Brother" who was raised at NPH) and a dentist, established a clinic on site and served both NPH residents and the surrounding community
- **El Salvador:** Received recognition from the community and other institutions for the positive impact of their work
- **Guatemala:** The Labor Insertion Program provided job training and education and placement assistance to 89 young men and women
- **Haiti:** Both schools completed the academic year despite socio-political unrest gripping the nation
  - **St. Damien Pediatric Hospital**: Remained open to serve patients amidst severe insecurity and violence
- Honduras: Improved all residences, enabling siblings to live together, and increasing privacy
- **Mexico:** Established partnerships in order to offer a wider range of programs to benefit the community
- **Nicaragua:** Expanded community outreach, including training parents, and workshops
- Peru: Rented a house to facilitate the transition to independent living for young adults entering higher education or vocational training
