



OUR CALLING

Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) means "Our Little Brothers and Sisters" in Spanish. NPH USA provides fundraising and volunteer programs for NPH to help children and youth break free from poverty by delivering essentials like nutritious food, education, health care, and job training.

Started by Father William Wasson in 1954, NPH has changed the lives of tens of thousands of vulnerable children and young adults in Latin America and Haiti.

Providing love and vital social services, NPH strengthens families and helps kids grow into independent, caring adults who give back to their communities, shaping brighter futures for themselves, their families, and their communities.

NPH USA also plays a crucial role in supporting St. Damien Pediatric Hospital, the only hospital in Haiti solely dedicated to pediatric and high-risk maternity care, and the only one in the country that offers pediatric oncology care.

THE DIFFERENCE WE'RE MAKING

Reuniting and strengthening families: Poverty often fractures families because parents do not have the means to provide essentials for their children. NPH puts the safety and rights of children first, assisting those who wish to be reunited with family members when safe and able. Intensive preparation and attention go into reintegrating children and adolescents with their biological families. Experts like psychologists and social workers provide specialized support and rigorous oversight to protect children and empower them to reach their goals.

Providing life-changing family wraparound services:

Impoverished communities are often lacking in basic social services, like access to healthy food, education, child daycare, therapy, or medical care. NPH diligently evaluates and fills vital gaps. It's not just what NPH does to help children and families, it's how. Over the decades, NPH has run excellent schools, medical clinics, food and agricultural programs, and vocational and life skills training programs, helping break the cycle of generational poverty.

Operating safe, nurturing homes: NPH began by providing homes for highly vulnerable orphaned or abandoned children—raising and caring for siblings together in a loving family environment. Medical clinics, schools, farms, therapy centers, and chapels were situated near the homes for holistic child development. Today, these homes house children who are not able to be fully reintegrated with biological family members for a variety of reasons, and hundreds of children in nearby communities benefit from NPH services and programs "on campus."

FAMILY AND COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING

Children grow best in the love and care of families. NPH helps vulnerable children by strengthening families, providing nutrition, education, counseling, health care, vocational and life skills training to empower them and enable them to thrive.

In 2023, after rigorous preparation, we successfully reintegrated 217 children with their biological families, keeping the rights and protection of the children as our top priority. Given the tremendous success of the community family centers in Guatemala and Honduras, we opened a new center in Peru. The Padre Wasson Community Center provides tutoring and educational assistance, economic empowerment, preventive healthcare services, and programs to foster healthy family relationships.

Many NPH residential homes are being reconfigured to accommodate siblings living together and, thanks to donor contributions, the Haiti home erected a 515-foot-long fence to eliminate a security threat and secure the foyer.

SUPPORT FOR THOSE WITH DISABILITIES

In the places we serve, living with a disability is unimaginably difficult due to cultural stigmas and the extraordinary cost and expertise of specialty treatment and medications. We help the most marginalized by giving them love, dignity, and the essential services they need. We serve these children into adulthood in both our residential homes and through outpatient therapy centers, providing medical care, occupational therapy, education, and stimulating ways to play and contribute their unique gifts.

This year, we opened a new facility in Nicaragua specifically for the care of children with disabilities. We also were able to expand our inclusive park at our Rancho Santa Fe home in Honduras to include accommodations for more children with disabilities and their families, so now all the children can play together.

EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT

In the areas where we operate, education is either inaccessible or unaffordable for legions of children. Whether we provide schooling directly or provide scholarships, our programs give vulnerable youth access to education, from pre-Kindergarten all the way through university. In societies where girls are particularly vulnerable, NPH offers them equal opportunity to learn and excel.

In 2023, we continued to fill vital educational gaps by providing tutoring, counseling, vocational training, and even parenting workshops. The end result is better educated and more productive young citizens.

In 2023, we built and renovated NPH schools, libraries, and science laboratories so children had safe, comfortable, and modern facilities in which to learn. We purchased and operated buses to get children to and from the schools. We hired teachers to instruct and tutor students.

An NPH education is unique in that it balances academic and vocational coursework. In 2023, we enrolled more community participants in the workshop program which will strengthen their abilities to find work, a stable income, and independence.

YOUTH AND ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

Developing youth in the communities we serve into healthy, productive adults is the key to breaking the generational cycle of poverty. In addition to traditional education, we provide well-rounded programs and workshops to ensure young people have both the soft and hard skills needed to build better futures for themselves and their communities. Character-building and life-skill training helps young people build self-esteem, make better decisions, and possess a service orientation.

In Mexico, we launched a new workshop for single mothers to develop skills and financial literacy so they can gain independence and stability. To develop important skills and achieve greater independence and stronger ties with community establishments, children and adolescents in Peru were integrated into artistic, cultural and sports workshops provided by the Municipality of San Vicente de Cañete. NPH Bolivia established a supportive environment for youth that equips adolescents with networking and other life skills necessary for progressive autonomy.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Each NPH home has a medical clinic so that the children have access to onsite medical care. We also offer health care services to surrounding communities. These clinics are a lifeline for those who would not otherwise have access to health care.

In 2023, we provided over 17,000 medical consultations. In addition to providing medical care for the sick, we provide preventive services to help children stay healthy. One preventive project we completed was an overhaul of the menus at our homes and community centers to ensure maximum nutritional value and boost children's immune systems to minimize preventable conditions.

St. Damien Pediatric Hospital

NPH's St. Damien Pediatric Hospital in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, is the only hospital dedicated to pediatric and prenatal care in the country of 11.5 million people. St. Damien provides the only pediatric cancer care in Haiti, is one of the few facilities that can handle high-risk OB and NICU patients, and is a leader in providing HIV education and care. Simply put, St. Damien gives health and hope to the people of Haiti.

In 2023, the socio-political situation in Haiti continued to deteriorate. Haiti faced numerous crises, including gang violence, political turmoil, and humanitarian issues. Haiti has been without unelected officials since January 2023. While the country grappled with political instability, gangs took advantage of its vulnerability. More than 40% of Haitians experienced food insecurity, and access to electricity, safe drinking water, sanitation, healthcare, and education was severely limited. As of December 2023, more than 310,000 people were internally displaced.

Despite these challenges, St. Damien Pediatric Hospital remained open and operational for the entire year. True to the vision of Father Wasson and a testament to the unwavering spirit of the St. Damien team, the hospital responded to the desperate needs of the Haitian people.

St. Damien relies almost entirely on donations to obtain life-saving medicines, provide treatment, and maintain the hospital. St. Damien is a shining beacon for vulnerable patients with nowhere else to go. Thousands of newborn babies, pregnant women, cancer patients, and many others receive quality, compassionate care thanks to a medical team that believes poverty should not be a death sentence.





THE FR. WASSON LEGACY ENDOWMENT

The Fr. Wasson Legacy Endowment Inc. (FWLEI), a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, Tax ID # 91-2005679, was founded in 1995 to help provide long-term financial stability for the homes and programs of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH). The Endowment consists of a diversified portfolio of equity, fixed income assets, and cash, governed by an independent board of directors and professionally managed.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS

Reported by Jack Hansen, President, FWLEI

As Chair of the Fr. Wasson Legacy Endowment (FWLEI), I am pleased to be able to share a short update on the many positive developments.

To start, the positive investment markets in 2023 helped the endowment portfolio grow 16.9%. At the end of Fiscal Year 2023, the FWLEI portfolio was valued at \$19.5 million. Longer term results are also very favorable. FWLEI's 10-year compound annualized rate of return has been 7.1%. Over the long term, FWLEI seeks to produce returns which closely track but modestly exceed market outcomes with a careful eye to managing risk and keeping costs low.

Why is FWLEI so important to NPH's long-term success in serving disadvantaged children and communities? Because FWLEI represents a long-term, stable source of funding for NPH's ongoing operations. Set up as a perpetual pool, FWLEI seeks to distribute approximately 5% of the pool's value each year to support NPH's operations. In 2023, FWLEI distributed more than \$940,000 to help the NPH mission. In summary, FWLEI helps bring a more secure future to the children and communities NPH serves.

With each gift, FWLEI's ability to help vulnerable children and communities increases, not only today but long into the future. This past year, FWLEI was blessed with several very large estate and living legacy gifts. Reflecting amazing generosity, the Richard Murray and R. Jean Gray estate gifts totaled nearly \$4.5 million. FWLEI also received very generous living legacy gifts. One living legacy gift was given as a "named fund" to honor the life of an NPH supporter and loved one. The other very generous dedicated living legacy gift will come in phases and is designed to provide financial support to young NPH adults moving on to university education. In total, these named funds will add over \$1 million to the FWLEI endowment. NPH is so very blessed to have so many creative, caring and generous supporters.

The FWLEI Board continues to be guided by an extremely talented and passionate team of volunteers. As a group, we are focused on creating investment success, the development of a deep, diverse and capable leadership team and the formation of donor support efforts to better serve NPH supporters and ensure long term success.

To close, I want to again thank all those that have contributed to FWLEI. This includes the very capable and dedicated board members, those who have made gifts in the past, and current FWLEI contributors. Thank you for helping build a bright future for thousands of children and families.

On behalf of the Fr. Wasson Legacy Endowment Board, and especially the children we serve across all our homes and programs, I am truly grateful to all who make possible this life-changing work.
