

Highlights

- **Bolivia:** Supported young adults transitioning from residential care to independent living.
- **Dominican Republic:** Obtained official permission to develop a polytechnic school to expand vocational and technical education
- **El Salvador:** More than 60 children participated in the Early Childhood program
- Guatemala: Hosted NPH's "Goal for Peace" soccer tournament creating unforgettable memories and fostering stronger bonds across countries
- Haiti: Schools remained operational as much as possible amidst national instability, and when attendance was impossible, staff ensured learning continued through alternative methods
 - **St. Damien Pediatric Hospital**: Continuously served patients despite severe insecurity and violence
- **Honduras:** Students with physical disabilities were integrated into regular classrooms
- Mexico: Offered parenting workshops, home visits to families, and invitations to recreational activities through community programs
- **Nicaragua:** Achieved a 96.5% school retention rate
- Peru: Provided academic support, school supplies, uniforms, and dental and vision care for children, and financial literacy workshops for mothers
